served with a regulatory notice, in particular any notice/measure concerning the Environmental Permitting Regulations 2010, the Water Resources Act (works notices), Environmental Protection Act 1990 Part IIA (contaminated land) and Part III (abatement notices). The presentations will include specific case studies.

## Topics:

- The role of the independent inspector on a statutory appeal, evidence & procedure.
- Statutory appeal as an alternative remedy a complete bar to judicial review?
- Judicial review as urgent interim relief.
- Can the absence of consultation be fatal to the notice?
- Initiating an appeal after the commencement of judicial review proceedings.
- Has the regulator identified the appropriate/responsible person: what is the right test? Can the regulator issue a notice or measure directly on a company officer?
- The application of EU law principles: proportionality, the precautionary principle and the harmonisation of environmental law across the EU.
- EU grounds and intensity of review.
- Legal certainty/particularity: does the notice comply with statutory requirements?
- What is the consequence of internal inconsistencies within an environmental permit?
- 'Rights of defence' and the de-registration of exemptions under the 2010 Regulations: when is de-registration possible and what is the role of judicial review as a remedy?
